From Pastor Deral

On Wednesday, March 5, we will join together with folks from the Christian/Baptist Church to celebrate Ash Wednesday. At its heart, the Lenten Season is a period of grief in recognizing our sin before a holy and just God.

But in reflecting on that, we also are overwhelmed at the love of our Savior. On the night before His crucifixion, He met with His disciples in an upper room. He spoke of many things, but one of the things He said twice that night was: "A new commandment I give you; that you love one another; even as I have loved you." (John 15:12, 17)

How wonderfully unforgettable that our Lord Jesus would give this command on a night when He was to go out and face all the forces of evil – a night of betrayal, denial, desertion – all prelude to His death. He would, and did, bear the awful trial and tragedy of the Cross – alone.

But it wasn't the end. His trial, crucifixion, and death were not the end! An unbelievably horrible death gave way to an unbelievably wonderful Life!

Jesus endured that lonely time, that we might never have to be alone as He was. When we face trials, we're not alone. When we face temptations, when we face persecution, when we face hard times, when we face disease, when we face setbacks, when we face criticism and misunderstanding – we're not alone! Even when we face our greatest enemy death, we are not alone! The love He shared and continues to show, He sends us out to proclaim – together.

We're never alone!
