### <u> Mid-Year 2025 Treasures Report</u>

As of mid-September, we have received General donations of \$79,866 with General expenditures of \$110,645. This compares with last year's General donations of \$70,288 and General expenditures of \$81,198 at the same time. We have also received \$1,094 in Special Offerings; \$1,900 to the Building Fund; and \$5,025 in Memorial donations.

As you can see, donations are up slightly from last year, but expenditures have increased much more. We have been covering for the shortfall with savings from previous years - where General expenditures were less than spending. These savings may last us through the rest of this year, and we are fortunate to have additional funds available in our endowment accounts if needed. With that said, we cannot continuously operate relying on those endowments. Your donations are needed and greatly appreciated.
